On 10th September 2022, The Salvation Army Regional Headquarters held a fundraising luncheon at Oriental Pavilion Restaurant in Petaling Jaya to raise RM400,000.

About 80 major supporters and invited guests were updated on how we have been using financial gifts during the last two years of the Covid-19 pandemic, and how we have been serving affected communities.




The event started with speeches by the Regional Officer, Major Francis Ng, and followed by Colonel Rodney Walters, the Territorial Commander of The Salvation Army Singapore, Malaysia and Myanmar, who explained the history and work of The Salvation Army in the country, and how it has assisted local communities.

Students from The Salvation Army Kuala Lumpur Kindergarten put up a riveting performance the song titled 听我说谢谢你 (translated to 'Hear me say thank you').

A former resident of the Ipoh Boys' Home, Paul Tang, came up to share his testimony on how it was like to grow up in a large family at the residential home, while receiving guidance and care from The Salvation Army. He credited his strong faith and present success in his business, personal and family life to the Almighty God and the officers who looked after him.

In the end, RM124,520 was raised and pledged for our community programmes throughout Malaysia. Although we were unable to hit our initial target, we are pleased with the outcome nonetheless as we were able to meet our supporters and explain what we do, and how we want to expand our outreach to communities in need.

Important: Your Tax-Exempt Receipt

The Inland Revenue Board (Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri or LHDN) has recently issued the revised [Guidelines for Application Of Approval Under Subsection 44\(6\) Of The Income Tax Act 1967](#) (dated 15 May 2019). According to the document, organisations are now required to only issue official tax exemption receipts for donors who provide the following particulars:

- Donor's full name as per NRIC / passport / business registration
- NRIC number / passport number / business registration number
- Complete mailing address of current residence / business location

When replying to us, please provide the above information to enjoy the benefits of your tax-exempt receipt. Thank you and we value your support.

Open Day Events in Sarawak



Our Kuching and Bintulu centres each successfully managed the Open Day event in the month of August, where members of the public can meet with The Salvation Army to know how we have been assisting in the community, and to also lend their support by partaking in its carnival-like event.

In Kuching, the Mayor of Kuching South, Dato Wee Hong Seng launched and visited the event. Together with members of the public, our Kuching centre managed to raise RM 218,526.00 for the Kuching community.

In Bintulu, the event was graced by the presence of Colonel Rodney Walters, the Territorial Commander of The Salvation Army Singapore, Malaysia and Myanmar, and also Colonel Wendy Walters, Territorial President for Women's Ministries. The carnival also included a blood donation campaign and together with their local community, more than RM 60,000.00 was raised for the Bintulu community.
