Melaka

The centre of operations for The Salvation Army in Melaka is located at Jalan Parameswara. The building complex houses a number of programmes. These include Hopehaven Special Needs Care Centre, Melaka State Community Services, a worship hall for the English and Tamil-speaking congregations and a collection centre for the Family Thrift Store.

HOPEHAVEN SPECIAL NEEDS CARE CENTRE

Now in its 30th year of operation, Hopehaven is synonymous with caring for individuals with special needs. The Centre is an integral part of the local community and is well known for its education and day-care services for individuals with conditions such as autism and Down's syndrome. The sheltered workshop programme offers skills training for young adults in a range of subjects including tailoring and cooking. Students are also taught life skills such as budgeting, personal grooming and how to use public transport. Hopehaven caters for up to 65 students and has a staff team of 11. Highlights for the past year have included the Open Day, where the students gave musical performances, and the development of a hydroponic gardening unit that introduces students to simple farming skills.





RAINBOW CLUB

The Rainbow Club programme, based at Jalan Parameswara, is a bi-weekly activity for senior citizens living in Melaka. Membership of the Rainbow Club has grown over the past few years and recent activities have included art sessions, banana leaf meals and visits to places of interest such as museums and heritage sites. MELAKA COMMUNITY SERVICES

The Melaka Community Services team assists families both in practical terms (with food parcels and teaching of home skills) and with counselling (helping to overcome psychological or emotional issues). The past year has seen a growth in the number of families and individuals requesting help. Each case is investigated by a community worker and care plan is formulated to offer the most appropriate aid.



MELAKA CORPS & MELAKA ERATCHIPPU CORPS

Two corps (churches) operate out of the building in Melaka. An English-speaking congregation and a church for the Tamil speaking community.

The Sunday programme for both churches include the main services and Sunday school. On Saturdays there are Youth Groups as well as musical rehearsals for Sunday's worship.



Batang Melaka

Located on the main road of this quaint border town in Jasin District, The Salvation Army's triangular building has been a feature of Batang Melaka since the 1950s. Through the years, different services have been provided from the building to the local community, including a maternity clinic. However, in recent years The Salvation Army in Batang Melaka has become well known for its education services through its kindergarten programme.



BATANG MELAKA OUTPOST

Church services are held every Saturday at the main hall of the Batang Melaka building. These include worship services in English, Tamil and Mandarin. For enquiries and details contact Melaka Corps & Community Services at 06 283 1203.

KINDERGARTEN

The Salvation Army Batang Melaka Kindergarten caters for up to 35 children. With all the facilities of a modern kindergarten facility, The Salvation Army is able to offer the very best in pre-school education to low and middle-income families in the Jasin area. Registration opens every October for the new school year and parents can expect quality education coupled with quality care for their children. For registration contact 06 446 1095.



Banting

Banting is situated on the Langat River, south of Kuala Lumpur. Known for its agriculture, the town is a hub for plantation crops such as palm oil. The Salvation Army opened its work in Banting back in 1995 when a rented shop-lot served as both the corps worship hall and day care centre. Today, Banting Corps and its associated services operate out of a new building in Bandar Sungai Emas, a suburb of Banting.

THE LEARNING CENTRE

The Learning Centre occupies the second level of The Salvation Army's property in Banting. It has a capacity for 35 students of Primary-school age that are given afternoon day care. Transportation is provided to collect students from local primary schools and after their lunch and rest time, a variety of educational programmes ensure a balanced programme for the children.

Families of the students do pay a small fee but the Centre is heavily reliant on the generosity of donors. Several children, whose single-parent families are extremely poor, are sponsored by a local doctor.

The Salvation Army is committed to providing educational and day care services to all children



BANTING ERATICHIPPU CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Church services in Banting are conducted in Tamil. These include worship, prayer meetings, youth fellowship, and Sunday-school. Although the Learning Centre is the main social service programme, the Corps Officers also conduct home visits to needy families in the Banting area. Kuala Lumpur & Selangor

The Salvation Army's operations in the Klang Valley include our Regional Headquarters in Puchong, the Red Shield Industries warehouse in Subang Jaya (see page 20), and Kuala Lumpur Corps in Taman Overseas Union. Kuala Lumpur Corps programme includes the Kindergarten and Community Services Team who provide assistance to needy families and individuals.



KINDERGARTEN

The Kindergarten at Taman Overseas Union has been in operation since 1974 with over two thousand students having received their pre-school education at The Salvation Army.

Today, the curriculum at the Kindergarten includes traditional and modern teaching methods. These include group activities such as outdoor games; learning via technology on computers and lap tops; learning via traditional phonics, alphabet, mathematics recital and flash cards; and game-based creativity activities such as Lasy Blocks and board games.



Parents who wish to enroll their children at the Kindergarten need to bring along the child for assessment. The registration fee is RM 70. Please bring along the child's birth certificate and MyKid card for registration too. For more information contact 03 7927 7972.

REGIONAL HEADQUARTERS MALAYSIA

The Salvation Army Regional Headquarters for Malaysia is in Bandar Puteri, Puchong. Six main departments provide management and logistical support to centres across both East and West Malaysia, namely: Programme; Finance; Human Resources; Public Relations; Information Technology; and Property. Two floors of the four-storey shop-lot (which houses the Regional Headquarters) are rented out and generate income for The Salvation Army.

KUALA LUMPUR CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Kuala Lumpur Corps has been serving the community in Overseas Union Gardens since 1965. As well as the weekly Sunday morning service, Sunday school, cell groups and the worship band preparation, corps members are actively involved in community and outreach projects. In September 2023 a “Shine the Light Nite” lantern festival event was held at Taman OUG centre and during December 2023 the corps Carol Singers performed at Sunway Putra Mall on weekends.

Kuala Lumpur Corps and Community Servicers also conduct outreach to the migrant community in the Klang Valley. Refugees from Myanmar are given practical and emotional support in the form of a variety of activities including an annual Christmas party.

Ipoh

The history of The Salvation Army in Ipoh goes back to 1940 when Lieutenant Sim Wee Lee was appointed Commanding Officer of Ipoh Corps which was then situated along Jalan Pasir Puteh. Today, Ipoh has five Salvation Army centres of operation, namely the Children's Home, Boys Home, Perak Home for the Aged, Ipoh Corps and the Family Thrift Store at Tambun (see page 20 for details on the Family Thrift Store).



IPOH CHILDRENS HOME CARE CENTRE

The Children's Home at Jalan Raja Permaisuri Bainun (Jalan Kampar) celebrated its 60th anniversary in 2023 with a two-day carnival. The event was themed '1960s Retro Agogo' to commemorate 60 years of caring for children in Ipoh. It was a fun-filled two days with games, dancing competitions and food trucks for the children and all the friends and supporters of the Home.

The Children's Home, which can accommodate up to 50 residents, enjoyed a year full of interesting activities including a trip to the Great British Circus at a local shopping mall in Ipoh.



However, the children's education remains the priority of the Home's programme. Study time, personal tuition, educational visits and talks all contribute to help improve each child's academic achievement.





IPOH CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

The Salvation Army Ipoh Corps and Community Services is situated in Taman Wah Keong near Kampung Simee in Ipoh. Community-based programmes include the distribution of food parcels and counselling.



IPOH BOYS HOME CARE CENTRE

Sports and recreation are much liked by the residents of the Boys Home. The property at Tambun is blessed with good facilities including areas for soccer, basketball and badminton. Over the years, many boys have excelled in sports at their schools, with some representing the Perak State in national competitions.

The Home has a music room where boys learn guitar, drums and keyboard. Other facilities include a tuition room and a computer lab.



Children From The Orang Asli Community

In 2019 The Salvation Army reached out to Orang Asli settlements in Perak. Our Homes in Ipoh began providing places for children who had either dropped out of school or their families faced hardships which affected their schooling. The objective was to give educational opportunities to Orang Asli children so that they could be responsible for their families in the future.

During 2023, the first batch of boys and girls have already reached secondary school, with the older ones completing their Form Five examinations. We are happy to report that, despite some challenges and failures, the majority of our Orang Asli children are doing very well in their academic studies. We are now helping the older ones to continue into tertiary studies or vocational training.

The Orang Asli children return to their families on a regular basis (school holidays, festivals and public holidays) so that they maintain the bonding that exists within their communities. But with the extra educational support and being able to learn English and other languages at our Homes, the Orang Asli children are more confident and better equipped to help their families.



The Orang Asli or aboriginals of Peninsula Malaysia have traditions that stretch back hundreds of generations. Their knowledge of the land and survival skills in the forests are second to none. The Orang Asli children bring this knowledge to our Homes and are able to share with the other children. So the benefit is a two-way process with our staff and other children learning from the Orang Asli community.

Perak Home For The Aged Care Centre

Situated in the suburb of Jelapang, under the sprawling hills that surround Ipoh, Perak Home for the Elderly provides a peaceful and serene environment for those enjoying their golden years. The single-story complex comprises of two wings, one each for male and female, plus a central dining and community area. The large gardens and parklands make for an idyllic setting for the residents.

Each resident has their own care plan and daily routine. However, there are plenty of activities that they can choose to join. These include gardening, cooking, music therapy, reading, exercise classes, outings and joy hours (Christian worship).

The majority of residents do not have surviving relatives, or for whatever reason, have lost contact with their family. The Home staff are on hand 24 hours a day to assist and befriend residents, especially with the increase in health-related issues that they face in their elder years.





ADMISSION

Admission to the Home is by application to The Salvation Army Ipoh Centres Admissions and Review Board. Applicants need to be 65 years or above. The Home does not provide nursing care so residents are expected to be ambulant and able to attend to their own daily personal needs. Where able, residents' families are required to make financial contributions to the Home. Should a resident require intensive nursing care, a more suitable care institution would need to be found. A Resident's Story

Madam Amy Khoo is 76-years-old and has been a resident of Perak Home for the past 14 years. In her younger days Amy was a car salesperson with a company based in Kuala Lumpur. With great fondness, she recalls the times her managers would request she deliver new cars to the East Coast before the highway was built and the sense of responsibility that was entrusted to her by the management.

Sadly, Amy lost contact with her siblings and, because she never married, she does not have visits from any family members. But she is happy to have many friends at Perak Home and eagerly participates in many of the programmes.

Penang

It was in 1938 that The Salvation Army arrived in Malaysia (then Malaya) when Adjutant Frederick Harvey opened the work in Penang. A year later in 1939, five Malaysian cadets entered the Training College in Singapore to become the first Officers in Malaysia. By the early 1940s they had established operations in Penang, Ipoh, Melaka, Kuala Lumpur and Kuching. Penang remains an important part of The Salvation Army's operations today. The four-storey Penang Children's Home Care Centre on Jalan Logan and the unique Penang Corps and Community Services building on Jalan Perak spearhead our ministry on the island.

PENANG CHILDREN'S HOME CARE CENTRE

Our Children's Home in Penang can accommodate up to 60 boys aged 5 to 18-years-old. The dormitories are housed on the second and third levels with hostel accommodation on the fourth level. The ground floor houses the kitchen, dining room, study hall, computer lab and offices.



In the past year, activities have included celebrating the many Malaysian festivals. The boys took part in Merdeka celebrations in August 2023 when they designed posters and banners for the 'Malaysia My Home' campaign. In December 2023 the boys enjoyed a trip to Ipoh to celebrate Christmas with their peers in the Ipoh Homes.

PENANG CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

In August 2023 members of Penang Corps and Community Services held a 'Walkathon' to raise funds towards the Helping Hand project. The Helping Hand project is a fundraising initiative to support The Salvation Army's work both in Malaysia and overseas. In 2023 the funds raised went towards the Army's work in Banting, Melaka and Kuching. An amount of RM5,800 was raised by the Penang Corps members from the Walkathon.



Fund Raising Events

After a 3-year hiatus due to the Covid pandemic, our centres in Penang, Ipoh, Melaka, Banting and Kuching successfully held their Open Day events in the period August to October 2023.

The Open Day events are charity food fairs, held on the grounds of our centres to enable the public to visit and know more about our work in their local communities. The events also help to generate funds for the centres with the help of family, friends, neighbours and supporters in a carnival-like atmosphere.

All funds raised help each of the centres to continue their work to care for our beneficiaries and those in need in their respective locations. In 2023 the five locations raised a total of RM 650,000 through Open Day events.

IPOH CHILDREN'S HOME CARE CENTRE 60TH ANNIVERSARY CARNIVAL

There was much excitement at the Children's Home in Ipoh during the weekend of the 4th and 5th November 2023 as the Home hosted its 60th birthday with a two-day public Carnival. The event was called 'Retro Agogo' with 1970's theme for dress and music. Many activities were held over the two nights such as song and dance performances, games, escape room, mini



zoo, bouncy castle, and Chinese drum lessons. Twenty food stall vendors provided a wide variety of local delicacies and as the sun came down the colourfully-decorated stage came alight as the children performed their songs and dances. Large crowds gathered on both evenings including many volunteer groups and other welfare institutions that had been invited to share in the celebrations. The Carnival raised RM 35,000 for the Ipoh Children's Care Centre

KUCHING CHRISTMAS CHARITY DINNER

Kuching Children's Care Centre in Kota Samarahan, Sarawak held a Christmas Charity Dinner at its multi-purpose hall on 16th December 2023 and raised RM 150,000 towards the running costs of the Centre. The evening's programme included music and drama

performances by the children and at the conclusion many of the over 400 guests stayed behind to enjoy the joyful atmosphere as everyone celebrated Christmas in their new Home in Kota Samarahan.



CHRISTMAS KETTLING CAMPAIGN 2023

The Salvation Army's Christmas Kettling Campaign started in 1891 in San Francisco, by a Salvation Army Officer Captain Joseph McFee who wanted to provide a free Christmas dinner to the poor of San Francisco. In 2023 our Malaysia campaign was held in shopping centres in Kuala Lumpur, Melaka, Penang, Kuching, Bintulu and Kota Kinabalu where our signature red kettle pots and bells could be seen. Our local Salvation Army teams sang carols and rang bells to inspire the public to make donations. The Kettling Campaign raised RM 75,000.

Kuching

The Salvation Army in Sarawak has modernised its services over the past year. The Kuching Corps & Community Services at Jalan Sekama and the Family Thrift Store at Jalan Ang Cheng Ho both remain, but the former Children's Home (Jalan Uplands) and Boys Home (Jalan Ban Hock) have been merged to create The Salvation Army Community Complex, incorporating the Kuching Children's Care Centre in a brand-new suite of buildings at Sungai Jernang in Kota Samarahan.

The Salvation Army Community Complex

INCORPORATING KUCHING CHILDREN'S CARE CENTRE

In September 2023, The Salvation Army Community Complex in Kota Samarahan was officially opened by the Premier of Sarawak, Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri (Dr) Abang Haji Abdul Rahman Zohari Bin Tun Datuk Abang Haji Openg. The new Complex features a Multi-purpose Hall and the 90-bed Kuching Children's Care Centre with associated facilities. These facilities include a computer laboratory, study rooms, a library, a play room, therapy room and a music hall.



The Multi-purpose Hall is equipped with badminton courts and facilities for banquets and large-group events. The hall can seat up to 600 people. Bookings are open to the public, with the proceeds helping to fund the operations of the Complex. For more information contact 082 502 215.





KUCHING CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

The congregation of Kuching Corps is active in providing community-based support in the Kuching and Sebuyau Districts in Sarawak. Sunday's worship programme includes Sunday school classes, prayer meeting and soldier's class (membership training). On Saturdays members of the congregation travel to the Outreach Centre at Kampung Kesindu in Sebuyau for prayer meeting and service. Once a month, the trip includes the distribution of food parcels to underprivileged families in the area.



A Client's Story

Helena (not her real name) is a 38-year-old single mother with five children. In June 2022 her husband was lost at sea after his fishing boat capsized. Because his body was never recovered, the family will have to wait seven years before a death certificate can be issued. This means obtaining official assistance is difficult. It was a tragic event with many subsequent challenges.



With The Salvation Army's help, Helena set about facing the challenges. Extended family members stepped in to help care for the children and Helena was able to find a job to earn income for the family. Our Social Worker visits once a month to offer practical and emotional support as Helena and her five children rebuild their lives.



Bintulu

The Salvation Army has been serving the Bintulu community since 1995. Our premises is located at Tanjong Batu Commercial Centre. Bintulu Corps and Community Services operate a Learning Centre and support a number of underprivileged families and individuals in the Bintulu area.

BINTULU CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Over the past year, we have steadily increased the outreach of The Salvation Army in the Bintulu and engaged in partnerships with local community organisations to benefit more underprivileged families and individuals in need.

As well as developing the Learning Centre, a regular food parcel ministry has been implemented. The Corps (church) members are actively involved in these ministries that benefit their local communities.



THE LEARNING CENTRE

The Learning Centre provides day care services to children aged 7 to 13-years-old (primary school). The majority of the students are from the Iban community, however there are students from other races. Fees at the Centre are kept to an affordable level so that our services help families in the low-income bracket.

Amongst the programme activities are outings to places of interest. In February 2023 the children went on a trip to Niah National Park and Niah caves. In December 2023 the children were treated to a range of Christmas activities including a Christmas party at the Centre.

Sabah

In the Malaysian State affectionately known as the ‘Land Below The Wind’, Sabah has two Salvation Army Centres of operations, one in Kota Kinabalu and the other in Kota Belud. Work began in Sabah in 1995 and since that time The Salvation Army has gradually molded its services to adapt to the different needs in local communities.

KOTA KINABALU CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Situated in the suburb of Inanam, Kota Kinabalu Corps and Community Services operate out of a shop-lot on Jalan Kiansom. The Corps Leader, Envoy Anthony Simon oversees community operations and church activities on Sundays. Twenty-five families and individuals in the Inanam area receive monthly food baskets combined with counselling.

In the past year, church activities have included a Women’s Fellowship trip by train from Kota Kinabalu to Tenom, a journey of historical and scenic value. The Men’s Fellowship, on the other hand, made a trip to Ranau in search of a local delicacy called ‘Sinalau Bakas’ or smoked wild boar. These fellowship trips strengthen the teamwork between members and allow low-income members the chance to experience happy times.



KOTA BELUD CORPS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

The Kota Belud Corps and Community Services are led by Envoys Andrew Sogindal and Aidah Justine. Their ministries include food parcel baskets to over 120 families in the Kota Belud area. In the past year, regular seminars and training camps have helped develop the skills and abilities of members as they seek to serve their community through The Salvation Army.

Red Shield Industries

Red Shield Industries (RSI) is the social enterprise arm of The Salvation Army. By re-using, recycling and restoring donations in kind from the public and corporations, RSI generates income through its network of five Family Thrift Stores to support our mission to provide holistic care to the community. The headquarters for RSI Malaysia is located at No. 15 Jalan Subang 17/1 Twin Park, Taman Perindustrian Subang, Subang Jaya in Selangor.

Last year saw our business begin to recover from the effects of the pandemic. Like many industries, RSI suffered badly for a number of years as both donations in kind dropped significantly and sales declined. Thankfully, during 2023 RSI regained profitability and is now back on track to contribute financially to The Salvation Army's mission.

COLLECTION OF DONATIONS IN KIND

FAMILY THRIFT STORES

There are five Family Thrift Stores in Malaysia, namely: FTS Subang Jaya; FTS Melaka; FTS Ipoh; FTS Penang; and FTS Kuching. They are open to the public from Mondays to Saturdays but are closed on Sundays and certain public holidays.

Each Store has a dedicated team of staff and volunteers who carefully sort the many donated items. Items are then displayed within the Store at affordable prices. We aim to provide all customers, particularly those on low-income, the opportunity to purchase goods that, despite being secondhand, may be still in very good condition.

Nothing goes to waste as even badly worn clothing gets recycled as rags and broken electrical equipment dismantled for parts.

CSR AND RECYCLING

RSI Malaysia welcomes anyone who wants to volunteer at its premises. In 2023, four corporate companies and two private institutions of higher education fulfilled their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) hours at the RSI Malaysia headquarters. Regardless of position and age, all volunteers were required to assist in sorting out the donated items received. At the end of their time, they all learned about the role of RSI in empowering communities to choose and purchase items they need at an affordable price, while RSI provides the opportunity to members of the public to safely declutter their premises with minimal impact to the environment.

Students from Methodist College Kuala Lumpur spent the most time at RSI. For one month, the students tirelessly helped to segregate the items received and also helped tidy up our Family Thrift Store in the premises.

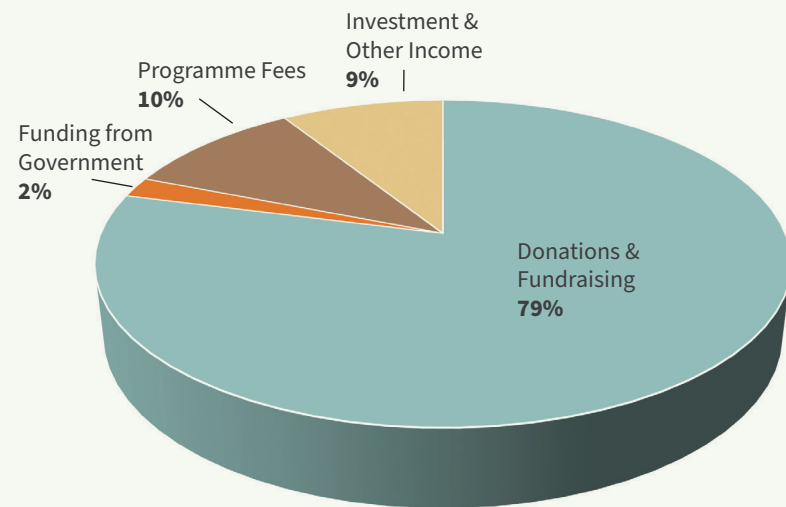

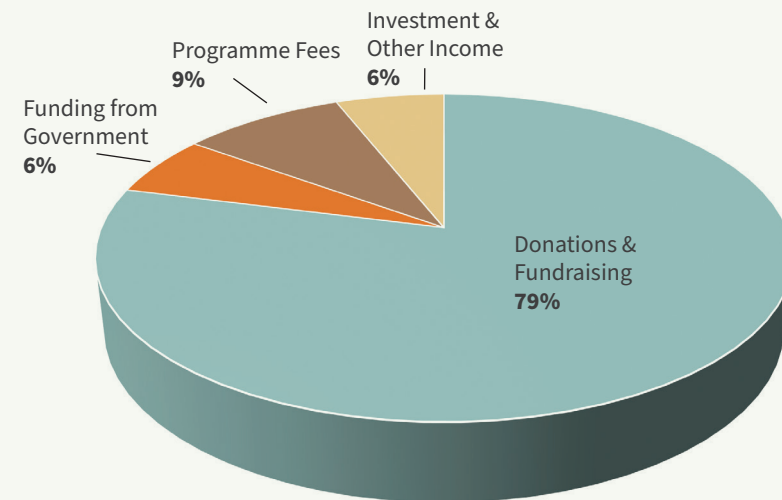

INCOME AND EXPENSES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2023



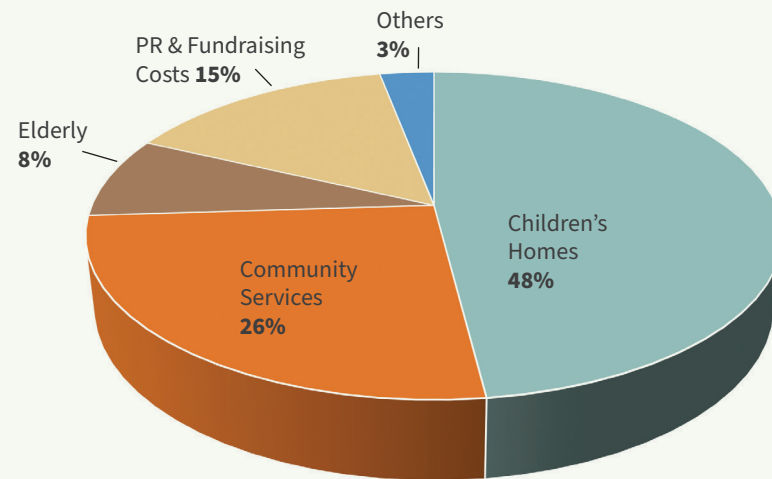
OPERATING INCOME 2023



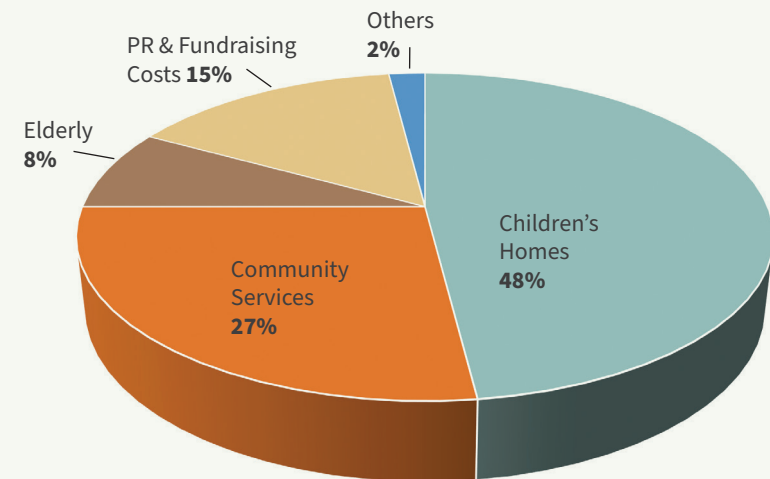
OPERATING INCOME 2022
